#### 2024 WINTER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING February 22, 2024 – Nicky's Lion Head in De Pere, WI

There were 12 members present when President Cappeart called the meeting to order at 5:52 pm

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Board meeting minutes from November 23, 2023

Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented in latest newsletter as there were no changes

The following reports were given: (\*email)

#### WSLS REPORT (Howard Herrild)

- Last Meeting was at the Institute on Friday, January 26, 2024
- Discussed the banquet meal issue had to pay for approx. 200 "extra" meals that people said were going to attend but didn't – more discussion needed. Michigan Institute charges \$700 for event (extra \$40 for the meal, although not as good as ours) with 280± people attending; Illinois Institute charges \$300± for event (no extra charge for meal, which is better than Michigan's meals) and has 750± people attending

- Lisa Van Horn AND Larry Miller were approved as a WSLS Life Member – CONGRATS!!

#### CST (Howard Herrild)

- CST Test/exam (levels 1 & 2) will be held at NWTC next week during regular class hours. There has been a lot of time spent on revamping and improving the current test – much better now
- There were approx. 8 people who took CST exam at the Institute
- 10 spots are left at NWTC exam all level testing is being offered




#### Spring 2023

#### **NSPS Spring Meeting and Student Competition 2023**

This Year's Student Competition was again run and organized by Young Surveyors Network in Washington, DC. The participation from Colleges around the County was excellent. In total, 24 schools from around the Nation competed in the competition, from Cal Poly Tech to the University of Puerto Rico and even Klein Collins High School from Texas.

The structure of the competition was similar to last year but due to the number of schools, half participated in the monument hunt portion one day, while the other half tackled the field exercises. The monument hunt consisted of each school paired with a young surveyor scavenging around the city for NGS monuments. They were given an ARCGIS field map app designed by Linda Foster, ESRI of the monuments that included the NGS data sheets. Different point values were given to over 60 monuments. Their appointed young surveyor recorded a picture of the monument and extra points were given to teams that posted a picture of the monument to social media. Lookup up #nsps and #ysn to





All field exercises took place in close proximity to the Washington Monument. The field exercises consisted of a 4 sided traverse, a level loop, and a triangulation exercise. Young Surveyors were at each station to set up the equipment, judge professionalism and time the students computations. For the traverse, students were given a compass and chain and needed to calculate interior angles, leg distances and calculate resulting coordinates. The level loop was done between 5 temporary monuments and judged on field notes and closing elevation. The triangulation exercise used

Washington monument as a backsight while set up on 2 other coordinate known monuments and tasked with turning angles on a T2 to calculate the coordinates of an unknown coordinate for the monument Jeffersons Pier. It was great to see the outside interest from passersby wondering and asking what in the world we are doing. Especially because students were given extra credit for wearing Surveying attire from any past time period. A huge thank you to Les and Lisa Van Horn for bringing the equipment from NWTC, WSLS



Foundation and their own personal collection and for guiding the traverse exercise.

A social event at the conclusion of the competition Thursday evening consisted of



Bingo, Cards and Bags. Friday morning, NSPS YSN held their spring meeting. This meeting was led by our new president Jacob Heck and we welcomed Nolan Mark as Vice President and Heather Keenan as Secretary. 35 young surveyors were in attendance from 21 different states! **Recent Activities** 

- NWTC students that participated in the student competition gave a presentation at NWTC on the competition and their experiences. This was followed by the students giving a tour of the surveying and engineering department. This was also the first time a NE Chapter meeting was held at NWTC.

#### September 2023

- Ammunition Plant Tour, Ho-Chunk Nation Presentation and PLSS Corner Hike
  - On Friday September 8th, 11 seasoned and young surveyors began by touring Badger Ammunition Plants Museum. Our guide was extremely knowledgeable and told us the story of how the land for Badger Ammunitions was acquired and how it was one of the largest producers of propellant and powder over the course of 3 wars. A Ho-Chunk Nation GIS/Ecologist then spoke on the management and importance of land that was acquired by the Ho-Chunk after the decommissioning of the ammunition plant. The ultimate goal of the restoration is to restore it back to native prairies in good time. The picture below is a rocket propellant test shaft that is built into a bluff face. One of the few structures being kept from the ammunition plant.
  - After lunch, we hiked to a PLSS corner adjacent to the Ho-Chunk land we just learned about. Bill Wenzel led us to the monument and explained his process in resetting it. This involved the recovery of a bearing tree that is soon to be lost most likely due to a lightning strike. Bill also spoke to us on his surveying career and good practice in surveying.





#### Kayak Float

Following our tour, we set up camp along the Wisconsin River and made our meal over the campfire. Everybody caught up around the fire and exchanged surveying stories and ethical surveying decisions. The next morning, we ate a hearty breakfast and kayaked from Prairie Du Sac, 6 hours to the property we were staying at. This was a weekend packed with education and relaxation.








